









PTC has a staff of 5 Social Workers. They assist 200 children and provide over 6000 hours of service each year. They are open 7 days a week to accommodate the parents and children. Amy cited statistics that Indiana is #2 in the nation for child abuse and Kentucky is #1. She also told us about the effects of being from a divorced family. It is very traumatic on the kids and increases likelihood of using drugs, being violent as well as many other emotional issues.

Our Foundation donated money to help set-up a Teen room at PTC. They also offer cooperative Parenting classes, and Video conferencing. Parenting Time Center's Mission is: Empower Parents and Children to Create Positive Relationships on a Safe and Nurturing Environment.

It was a great meeting.
